
On March 18, 2025, the second day of the Raisina Dialogue in New Delhi is underway.

Will India lower levies before US rolls out reciprocal tariffs on April 2? Trump says 'I believe...'

US President Donald Trump hopes India will lower taxes on American goods before retaliatory taxes kick in on April 2. US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent has said that Countries that fail to reduce their trade barriers will face steeper tariffs aimed at protecting the country's economy.

Talking to *Breitbart News*, Potus said, "Believe India is probably going to be lowering those tariffs substantially. But on April 2, we will be charging them the same tariffs they charge us."

His comments come days after Trump said New Delhi has agreed to lower taxes. "India charges us massive tariffs. Massive. You can't even sell anything in India... But they have agreed, by the way; they want to cut their tariffs way down now because somebody is finally exposing them for what they've done," he said.

US Attorney General Pam Bondi on Tuesday called the recent attacks on Tesla dealerships "domestic terrorism" aimed at Elon Musk.

"The swarm of violent attacks on Tesla property is nothing short of domestic terrorism," Bondi said in a statement on Tuesday.

She said the Department of Justice has already charged "several perpetrators with that in mind," including some cases that involve charges with five-year mandatory minimum sentences.

The streets of Istanbul in Turkey were overrun by thousands of protesters on Wednesday (March 19) following the arrest of the city's Mayor Ekrem Imamoglu, just days before he was set to be named the opposition's candidate in the next presidential election going up against Recep Tayyip Erdogan.

"This is not democracy", yelled the demonstrators even as authorities tried to curb the unrest by blocking roads, restricting access to social media platforms, and imposing a four-day ban on demonstrations. However, Imamoglu's supporters gathered outside Istanbul's police headquarters, City Hall, and the headquarters of Imamoglu's Republican People's Party (CHP), denouncing the arrest.
