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25 bilateral meetings

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Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus is set for a packed diplomatic schedule in New York tomorrow (September 25), with a series of high-level bilateral meetings and international events.

According to Chief Adviser's Deputy Press Secretary Abul Kalam Azad Majumder, Prof Yunus will begin his day by attending the opening segment of the First Biennial Summit for a Sustainable, Inclusive and Resilient Global Economy: Implementing Commitments on Financing the Sustainable Development Goals at 9:00am.

This will be followed by a speech at 'UNGA High-Level Working Session: Transforming Primary Healthcare – Bangladesh's Blueprint' at 11:00am, where he is expected to highlight Bangladesh's achievements and strategies in primary healthcare.

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His bilateral meetings for the day are scheduled as follows:

10:00am – Meeting with Alexander Stubb, President of Finland

At 1:00pm, Prof Yunus will attend the "US-Bangladesh Executive Business Roundtable: Advancing Reform, Resilience and Growth", hosted by the US-Bangladesh Business Council (USBBC), where business cooperation and economic reform are expected to be discussed.

Later in the day, at 3:00pm, he will be called on by the Club de Madrid, a forum of former heads of state and government promoting democratic leadership and governance.

The chief adviser's day will conclude with a private dinner at 7:15pm, marking the 3rd anniversary of the Ban Ki-moon Foundation.

Prof Yunus is currently in New York leading Bangladesh's delegation at the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA), engaging in discussions to strengthen diplomatic ties and promote sustainable development.

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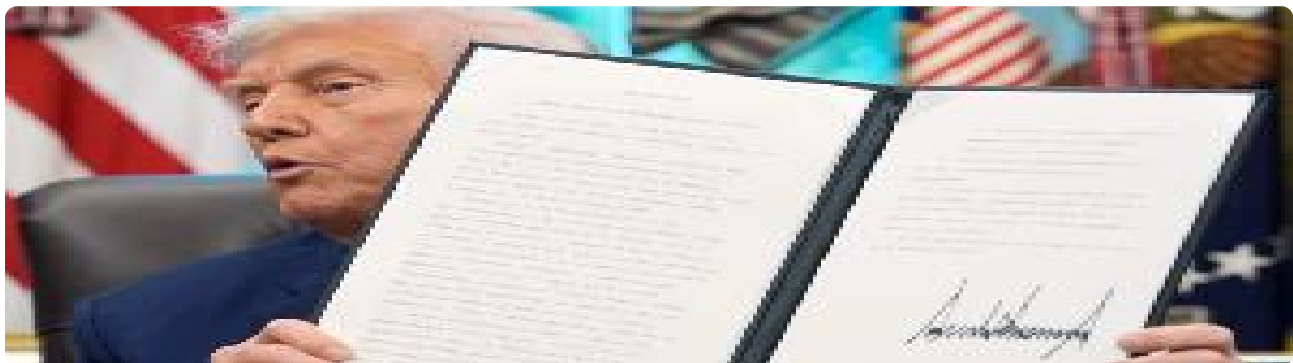
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
